◆ NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS ◆

Please note: Any bank charges incurred in connection with dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the exhibitor.

If you are exhibiting, and are required in two different rings at the same time, please inform the stewards in both rings so that they can help you, so as not to miss your classes.

Dogs are allowed to leave the show after they have been exhibited in all classes for which they are entered. No dog/bitch other than one officially entered shall be brought into the limits of the Dog Show during its continuance, except a registered Guide Dog for the Blind or Hearing Dog for the Deaf (re Kennel Club regulations).

Areas for cages will be provided - No cages allowed in gangways or at the roadside. (in accordance with Kennel Club regulations).

ALL EXHIBITORS CARS are to be parked in the main car park, disabled drivers will have an area marked out at the front of the main car park, but **MUST DISPLAY** their "Blue Disabled Badge" with current photo.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL DOG SHOW EXHIBITORS

The General Committee of the Kennel Club has approved a recommendation which requires exhibitors to display the exhibit/bench number on their crate, cage or container at all times. This is particularly important when cages etc are not on benches, and at unbenched shows. Each exhibitor is responsible for providing their own crate or cage identification and should note that the original exhibit/bench number card, as provided by the show society, must not be used for this purpose.

TAKE UP THE GOOD CITIZEN CHALLENGE AT WORTHING & DISTRICT CANINE SOCIETY



A Kennel Club Good Citizen Dog Scheme Ring will be set up at the show, offering exhibitors the opportunity to take part and achieve their Bronze Award.

The Scheme is designed to promote responsible dog ownership for all types of dogs, young or old. There are 10 tests, Cleanliness & Identification, Collar, Lead & Equipment, Walk on Lead, Control at Door/Gate, Controlled Walk Among People and Dogs, Stay on Lead for one minute, Grooming, Examination of the Dog, Return to Handler, Responsibility & Care. Whether you have a domestic pet dog or a show winner a well behaved dog is of primary importance.

Testing sessions will be held throughout the day on a first come first served basis. So come along to the ring when you have a spare moment and take part. No need to pre-book. There will be a donation of £5.00 per dog to take the test.

A certificate will be issue if the exhibit passes the required standard. Do remember that your dog must have a engraved ID Tag on their collar to take the test.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 9.00am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30am for Y.K.C. and 10.00am in all other rings.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching area is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **Entry Fees:**
Members: £5.00 per dog for first entry, £1.25 with each subsequent entry with same dog. Non-Members: £6.00 per dog for first entry, £1.50 with each subsequent entry with same dog. Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid. Membership £2.50 single, £3.00 joint, £1.00 junior (up to & including 16 years of age) due 1st January annually. Y.K.C. junior and handling classes £1.50 per entry. NFC £1.00 per dog
7. **Prize Money:** is only on offer in the Memorial Stakes Classes: £30.00 in each class.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **Best Puppy in Show** From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information) Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best in Group or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best in Group and Best in Show respectively.
Best Puppy in Group and subsequent group placings must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners provided they are unbeaten by any other puppy.
- Withdrawal from Other Competition.* Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes or Best Puppy in Breed prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes.
- Proviso.* For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **Best in Show** From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information). The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. **Best of Breed.** Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared. **Best of Group** From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information). Best of Group and subsequent group placings, must be selected from a) the Best of Breed winners in each group provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs. b) the best unbeaten winning dog from the any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day. **Best in Show** From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information) Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners provided they are unbeaten. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
- Withdrawal from Other Competition.* Dogs which become eligible for Best of Group and Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best of Group and Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best of Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes.
- Proviso.* For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
16. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
17. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
18. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days** Kennel Club Show Schedule Notice
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
19. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered
 20. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
 21. The Show Management may exclude or remove any dog which, in their opinion or that of a Judge, is not in a fit state for exhibition.
 22. PASSES: Exhibitor's passes will NOT be sent out. Please enclose a stamped addressed postcard or envelope if acknowledgement of entries is required.
 23. All dogs entered at the show will be entirely at the owners risk, and the committee will not accept any responsibility for any loss, damage or injury, howsoever caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show..
 24. JUDGES: Should any Judge be prevented from fulfilling his or her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge or Judges in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition, but no entry fees will be refunded.
 25. UNENTERED DOGS: No dog other than a dog duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
 26. The Committee will take due care to see that dogs are taken into the ring for competition, but if not present when required for judging the Committee will not accept responsibility for their absence from the ring.
 27. DOG FOULING: Exhibitors/Handlers are responsible for clearing up and removing any loose dog hair or fouling from dogs in their charge, or any litter, whether from the car park, the exercise area or from any part of the venue.
 28. Parents/Guardians will be held responsible for the actions and any damage caused by their children within the environs of the Show.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Member's classes or competing for Member's Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 14th August 2017.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted.

First prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this Regulation are: From 1st January 2017, and for a period of one year the Kennel Club Show Regulations which stipulate that dogs must be entered and exhibited in a breed class before exhibiting in an Any Variety Class/Stakes Class and that only unbeaten dogs are eligible to Compete in the group or best in competitions are suspended. (Please refer to the FAQs on the Kennel Club Website for further information).

(1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed.
 (2) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class. (3) A dog in Any Variety Champion Class. (4) As provided in Kennel Club Definitions of Classes. (5) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge. (6) A dog in Good Citizen Scheme Classes. (7) Exhibits bred by the scheduled breed Judge.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) Withdrawal ; The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20. (2) Transfer a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy, Puppy & Junior excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height. b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of their being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight and height.d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL YEARLING For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS For owner, handler and exhibit not having won a First prize at a Championship Show.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN (7 - 9 Years) For dogs of not less than seven years of age & not having reached their 10th birthday on the first day of the show.

SPECIAL VETERAN (10 Years +) For dogs of not less than 10 years of age on the first day of the show.

BRACE: For two exhibits (either sex of mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some other class other than Brace.

A.V.N.S.C: For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled.

AV CHAMPIONS CLASS: All exhibits must be Champions or Show Champions, The winner is NOT eligible to compete for Best in Show unless declared Best of Breed or Best AVNSC.

YOUNG KENNEL CLUB HANDLING CLASSES: Exhibitors may handle any dog provided it is fully registered on the Kennel Club Breed Register, and eligible to be exhibited at a Kennel Club licensed event. The 1st placed exhibit from each handling class will be invited to take part in a Handling Competition at Crufts 2017 provided as from 1st December 2015 they are a fully paid up member of the YKC. For the purpose of these classes ages should be calculated as their age on the first day of the show. Entries must be made on the enclosed entry form. You are reminded that DOGS must be entered in a breed/variety class first where such a class is provided. PLEASE NOTE: Handlers do not need to be YKC members to enter the handling classes, but must become a YKC member to take part in the YKC Handling competition at Crufts 2017.



By Road (From the M23) :
